CEO Notes

With Parkside's scope of services, we have residents with variable levels of care. We have identified that one thing that will have a huge impact on our ability to care for our residents is a wheelchair accessible van to take residents to and from appointments. Currently we have a van that has a mobile chair to lift residents in and out of the van, but the problem is that residents have to stand up and transfer to the chair. This is not an option for some of our residents who no longer have the ability to stand and transfer. We currently are using our large bus with the wheelchair lift for transportation needs when a resident is in a wheelchair and unable to stand and transfer.

Although, the bus is a solution to our transportation needs, it is not the best option. A wheelchair accessible van will be best for our residents' comfort, safety, and the most economical and fuel efficient option. We currently have a special donation fund for the wheelchair accessible van with a balance of \$15,943.11. We have been able to collect funds by hosting events such as a 2022 Hearts 4 Him Concert on campus, participating in the Hillsboro Farmers Markets, and by generous personal donations to the special fund. We will be hosting Hearts 4 Him on campus again on September 24th, at 7:00 pm. All proceeds from the concert will go into the special donation fund for our wheelchair accessible van. If you are not able to make it to the concert, you can still make donations via mail or in the business office.

As a non profit, we do rely on the support of our community for special projects. This is a great example of the support that you and our Hillsboro community has for Parkside. Thank you! **Stephanie Bryant, CEO**
