CEO Notes

The Scope of Service for our Independent Living Residents in the Duplexes was a topic brought up in our most recent Board Meeting. There had previously been a question through conversation regarding what Parkside can provide the Independent Living Residents when a bathroom call light or a pendent call light is pulled. To help clarify the Scope of Services, I will refer to the Resident Agreement:

"Parkside and/or its agent may enter the premises immediately in the event of an emergency and take any and all actions necessary for the protection of life and property."

This statement alone needs more clarification to understand the exact actions Parkside's employees will take if the call light is engaged. Our first action will be to call the Resident of the Duplex. We have a list of all Duplex Residents' numbers at the phone for the Staff to use. If we have more than one staff member available working in the Parkside Apartments, we will send a staff member over to evaluate the situation.

We will call 911 on their behalf if we cannot reach them by the phone and we cannot make it to the Duplex. This action of calling EMS will be without delay on behalf of the Resident safety. We have a safety box available to EMS which holds a master key for the Duplexes. This can and will be used by EMS to gain access to the Duplex in the event of an emergency.

One thing that is out of the Scope of Service is assistance with help off the floor after a fall. Parkside is a No-Lift Facility which means that we use mechanical lifts for lifting Residents. Assisting a Duplex Resident off the floor does not follow our Parkside Workers Safety Policy.
