

Non emergency maintenance request: Call the Parkside main phone number (620)947-2301 during the hours of 8:30 am- 4:30 pm and place a maintenance request with the business office. Emergency maintenance request: If there is an emergency between the hours of 8:30 am- 4:30 pm call the Parkside main phone number to have the business office send maintenance immediately to your location.

If the **emergency occurs during times when the business office is closed**, call the maintenance on call number at (620)877-7789. If there is not an immediate answer from the maintenance on call, call the Parkside main phone number and it will be routed to the healthcare charge nurse. The charge nurse will contact the maintenance on call.
